### Speaking Test Examiner Accreditation

#### Seeking accreditation as a Speaking Test examiner?

The Speaking Test components of Cambridge IGCSE English as a Second Language, (Component 5 speaking endorsement and Component 6 count-in speaking) are conducted and marked by teachers.

In order to ensure quality and consistency in the marking between schools and from one year to the next, Cambridge requires all teachers who will be conducting and marking these tests to be Accredited Speaking Test Examiners.

All schools should register these examiners with Cambridge using the [Teacher Assessment Form 1](#).

In order to become accredited, teachers should submit a full and detailed C.V. to:

The C.V. should include:

- positions held and the roles carried out whilst in that position
- qualifications
- teaching experience (including examination boards and syllabuses)
- experience of coursework, moderation and moderation training
- any further relevant experience.

**Please note that the C.V. route is the only way that teachers will be able to acquire accredited status.**

You should expect the processing of each application by Cambridge to take between 4–6 weeks from receipt. Each application carries an administrative fee.

If you have already acquired accreditation using a previous Speaking Test Training Handbook or by sending in your C.V. there will be no need for you to reapply.

A revised Speaking Test Training Handbook is currently under development containing guidance, advice and marking practice exercises. This handbook will provide a second route to accreditation via an accreditation test. It will also be useful at the outset of the course, helping teachers to align their teaching to the assessment criteria and familiarising them with the test.
